What is Evangelism through Education?

Evangelism through Education (or E.T.E.) helps churches (or church members) evangelize nations and neighborhoods by establishing either Christian Mission Schools or Children's Afterschool Reading Enrichment programs.

E.T.E. enables churches to provide literacy skills through online and in person schools or supplementary reading classes.

What is a C.A.R.E. Program?

E.T.E. equips churches to start their own C.A.R.E. programs.

C.A.R.E. stands for:

Children's **A**fterschool **R**eadings **E**nrichment programs.

C.A.R.E. programs serve students from kindergarten to third grade.

Students learn how to become exceptional spellers, readers, and writers.

C.A.R.E. programs also help students overcome reading disabilities such as dyslexia

How does E.T.E. help churches start C.A.R.E. programs?

E.T.E. provides self-teaching videos that make teaching and learning easy and exciting.

Churches (or church members) only need a laptop, projector, and screen (or blank wall) to teach by playing the videos for the children.

Only one or two instructors are needed to walk around the room and ensure that kids are following the interactive video instructions.

Alternatively, E.T.E. can be presented online so that kids can use devices to log in and work at their own pace.
