## Conclusion:

Sound and Say Spelling is the best way to help students to learn to read because it focuses them on analyzing the sounds within spoken and printed words.

## Step-by-step

- 1. **Hearing**: The brain disassembles spoken words from their speech packets and turns them back into individual phonemes.
- 2. **Spelling**: The brain names (or labels) each sound by matching or identifying each phoneme with a phonogram, which is a letter or a combination of letters created to represent specific sounds. Students **say the names of the sounds** and write them down.
- 3. **Basic Writing**: Writing is the process of printing phonemes as phonograms. It's the process of converting (or translating) speech sounds into the letters or letter-combinations that represent those sounds. As such, writing is spelling in printed form.
- 4. **Reading**: Reading is the process of converting phonograms back into phonemes. It's the process of translating printed letters and words back into the spoken sounds they were meant to represent.
